


CLASSROOM #127





























FROM THE LUNCHBOX

TREAT YOUR SWEETIE TO THESE DELICIOUS SUGAR COOKIES!

INGREDIENTS

- 1 Cup unsalted butter
- 1 Cup white sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon almond extract
- 1 egg
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 cups all purpose flour

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat oven to 350° F.
- Cream together butter and sugar.
- Mix in extracts and the egg.
- Add in the dry ingredients.
- Roll dough out on a floured surface, 1/4 inch in thickness and cut.
- Bake cookies for 6-8
